SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Our first day of our work week started by being a hot one. We were busy right from the beginning. I spent some of the morning facilitating the assignment of an officer at one of the Modesto hospitals to watch over the domestic violence arrestee from the night before. I had an officer at the hospital for approximately 5 hours, until the arrestee was medically cleared for booking. Once he was cleared, he was booked without incident. Officers responded to 2 violations of court orders, one of which was a domestic violence restraining order. The suspect was located a short distance away and was arrested for the violation. Officers also responded to a call of a juvenile who was shot at by other juveniles riding by. Officers located the 4 suspects, who turned out to all be juveniles. The suspects had shot at the victim with "orbies" gel pellets. No injury was sustained and the parents of the suspect juveniles were contacted.
