Officers were dispatched to a family disturbance. An intoxicated male was involved in an argument with his adult sister and grandfather. During the incident the male picked up a vacuum cleaner and threw it, striking his sister on the chest with it. The male then went outside where he kicked his sister's vehicle, breaking one of the windows. He was arrested and booked into jail for vandalism and battery. Officers then responded to a different family disturbance shortly after. Another intoxicated male was yelling at his grandmother. He was determined to have misdemeanor warrants for his arrest and was contacted outside the home. due to his intoxication and the likelihood of the disturbance continuing, he was booked into jail for his warrants.
